

MINUTES OF TIMBERVILLE TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
August 10, 2017

The regular monthly meeting of the Timberville Town Council was held Thursday, August 10, 2017 at 7:00 p.m in the Timberville Council Chambers with Mayor Donald Delaughter presiding.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Mayor Delaughter led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

Wilda Wine reported that the auditors began the audit on Wednesday, August 2nd. They may need to come back a day or two to finish.

BILLS FOR PAYMENT: No quorum established.

POLICE REPORT: Police Chief J. R. Dodd reported that the first National Night Out event went well. He thanked the front office staff and the fire department volunteers for their help. He also thanked all the local businesses (Cargill, Pilgrims, F&M Bank, Wal-Mart, Timberville Fire Dept., Rt 11 Chips, Crazy Critter Karaoke and T & T Fun Zone) who donated. The event came in at the \$1000 budget and Wal-Mart helped to off-set that with grant money. He estimates around 250-300 in attendance. Overall, he was very happy with the event.

PUBLIC WORKS: Council members received a copy of the jobs completed by the maintenance department since last meeting and July's BOD's. Austin Garber stated that letters were sent out to property owners and other interested parties of 304 Second Avenue informing them of the deadline to take action. The Council gave until the September council meeting. Austin stated in the letter the deadline would be the day before the September council meeting, to allow him time to notify.

Quinton Callahan sent an email to the American Legion's legal counsel to find out if the deeds will be ready by the special meeting on August 24th.

AutoZone requested a variance. There will be a BZA public hearing on Monday, August 21st at 7:00 p.m. to discuss that.

Austin sent out letters to each resident on Rill Road inviting them to the Planning Commission Meeting/Special Council work session on August 24, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. involving the Summit.
